



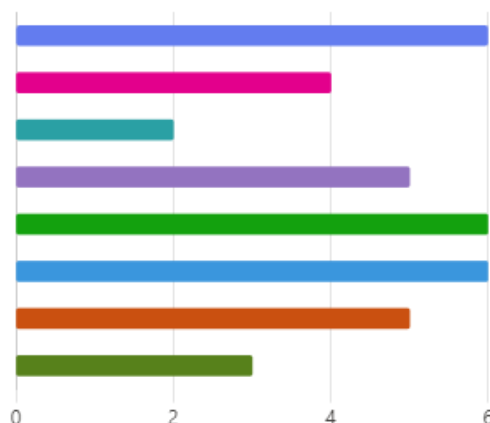
St Lewis' Catholic Primary School Parent View Survey: November 2024

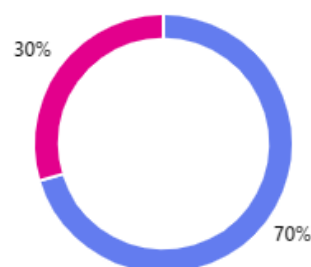
Thank you to everyone who took time to respond.

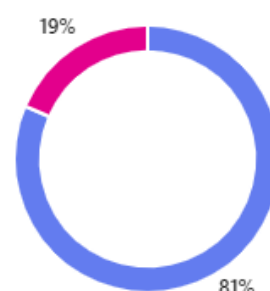
My child is happy at this school

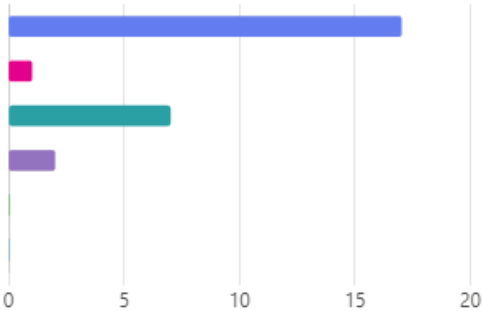

My child has been bullied and the school dealt with the bullying quickly and effectively

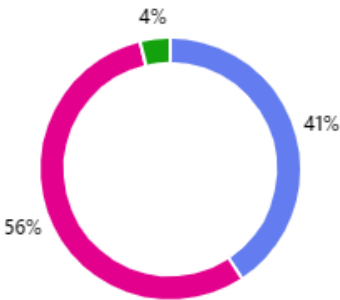

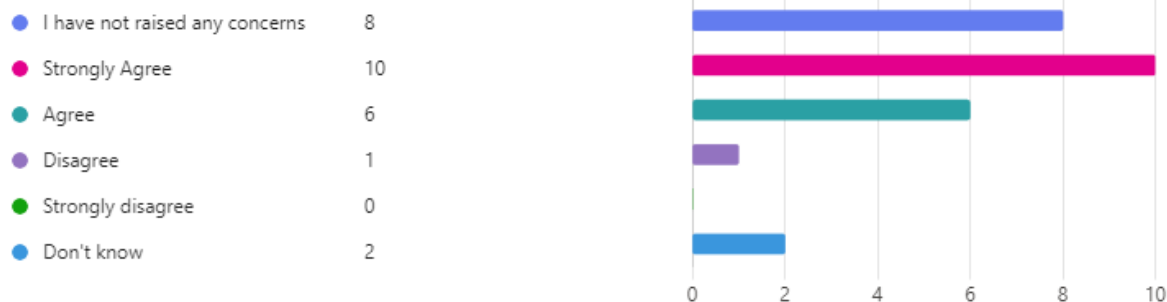
The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year

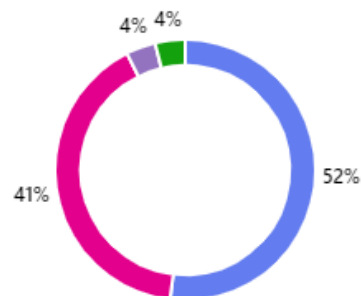
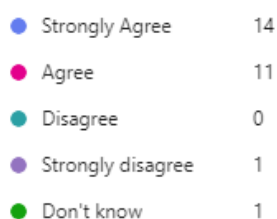
Curriculum information is available on the school website. Those who attended the "Meet the Teacher" Open Evening in September will also have been provided with curriculum information specific to your child's year group.

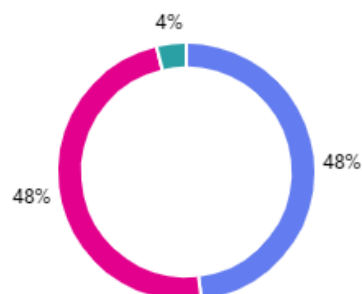
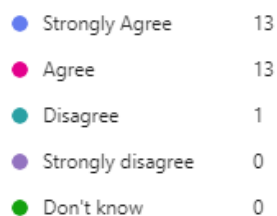
The school has high expectations for my child



My child does well at this school



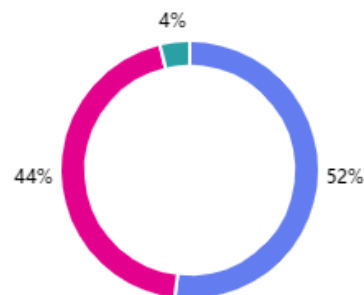
The school lets me know how my child is doing



There are regular opportunities for parents and carers to meet with teachers to find out how children are progressing in school. In September, the "Meet the Teacher" Open Evening is an early opportunity to meet staff and informally discuss how your child is settling into their new class. There are then 2 face-to-face Parents' Evening meetings offered followed by an end of year written report. Staff are also available to meet with parents/carers at any point throughout the year, should this be requested.

Children at St Lewis' enjoy a broad and balanced curriculum which includes all subjects required by the National Curriculum. An overview of the curriculum can be found on the school website.

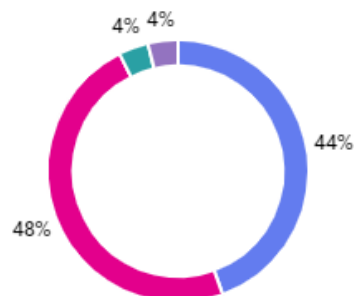
My child can take part in clubs and activities at this school

Provision for children's personal development is delivered more formally through Religious Education, Relationships Education and PSHE.
