A woman caught in adultery is brought to Jesus to see if He would call for her to be punished in accordance with the Law of Moses but Jesus uses the situation to remind His listeners of their own sinfulness. Jesus is merciful to sinners, and challenges us all to look at our own attitudes and our tendency to judge others. He looks around for those who will condemn the

woman but they have disappeared. He will not condemn her either!

He gives us the freedom to leave behind the things of the past and to go forward in a new and very different kind of way. God's gift of mercy is the bridge that connects God and man and opens our hearts to a hope of being loved despite our sinfulness. We not only receive mercy from God in Christ but are called as the Church, the brothers and sisters of Christ, to show mercy to others.

Pope Francis puts it like this: "In short, we are called to show mercy because mercy has first been shown to us. Pardoning offences becomes the clearest expression of merciful love, and for us Christians it is an imperative from which we cannot excuse ourselves. At times how hard it seems to forgive! And yet pardon is the instrument placed into our fragile hands to attain serenity of heart. To let go of anger, wrath, violence, and revenge are necessary conditions to living joyfully."

Let us therefore ask the Lord's mercy for our sins so that with pure hearts we may be instruments of his love and mercy to others.

The important vote for all MPs on the assisted suicide legislation, known as the *Terminally III Adults (End of Life) Bill*, **is likely to take place on 25**th **April**.

The charity Right to Life UK has a simple online mechanism to allow people to contact their Member of Parliament and it only takes a few moments to submit a message to ask an MP to stop assisted suicide being rushed into law.
