In today's Gospel Jesus challenges two popular beliefs: that people get what they deserve and that the key values in organised societies are production and profit. Previously, Pope Francis has urged us to think again about having a more merciful way of seeing that puts people, not consumption or profit, at the centre of our economy.

How can it be that it is not a news item when an elderly homeless person dies of exposure, but it is news when the stock market loses two points? Can we continue to stand by when food is thrown away while people are starving? How conscious am I of those who produce the goods I consume and how does this awareness affect the choices I make?

Today everything seems to come under the laws of competition and survival of

the fittest. As a result masses of people find themselves excluded and marginalised: without work, without possibilities, without any means of escape...human beings themselves are becoming "consumer goods" to be used and then discarded! What will we do to help those in our community who are struggling? What more can we do?
