Some highlights for me have been:

Foundation—Watching them welcome new starters in to Nursery and being so caring towards them. Also, seeing the fantastic progress that all of the class have made in their phonics, mark making and writing this half term.

Y1/2—Listening to their 'Superhero' tunes that they created in music and reading their dragon stories inspired by the text 'The Dragon Machine'
