

In today's Gospel, John the Baptist is inviting us to look closely at Jesus. He calls Jesus the '**Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world**'. We say these words often at Mass and today we are invited to meditate on them more closely. What does it mean? The lamb is one who is sacrificed... the sins of the world are many, broken relationships with one another at every turn. Today we are asked to think especially of Refugees and Migrants and the sins committed against them.

The treatment of these groups who are marginalised, exiled from their homes due to war, famine, drought, unemployment is often unjust and is part of what Pope Francis referred to as a culture of 'slave labour'. These outcast groups are frequently treated with disrespect, racism, condemnation and resentment.

A message from Pope Francis' may guide us closer to understanding the message of John the Baptist in the Gospel: 'Migrants and refugees are not pawns on the chessboard of humanity... A change of attitude towards migrants and refugees is needed on the part of everyone, moving away from attitudes of defensiveness and fear, indifference and marginalisation – all typical of a throwaway culture – towards attitudes based on a culture of encounter, the only culture capable of building a better, more just and fraternal world'.

In the marginalised can we see Jesus coming towards us and say: 'Look, there is the lamb of God'?
