
Thank you to those who took time to respond to this survey about provision and support for children with SEND at St Lewis' Catholic Primary School.


My child is well supported in their learning through personalised targets, intervention and provision which meets their individual needs.

I receive regular feedback on how well my child is progressing towards personal targets set.



I am informed when outside agencies are visiting my child and receive up to date reports.




I know who to talk to if I have concerns about my child's


The SENDCo is approachable and available

The school's policy on SEND is clear and I have access to a copy on the website if needed.


