Lent is a time of renewal and new beginnings. It is a time for us to enter into the suffering and death of Jesus, before celebrating the joy and hope of Easter. It is a time to reflect in a special way on God's word. Jesus tells us in today's Gospel that God's words are nourishing – man does not live on bread alone. Our focus should not only be on earthly things.

Lent reminds us that there is more to life than the physical world. We are all guilty of getting caught up in the practicalities of life; it is only natural to work and rush and plan and worry. Lent offers us an opportunity to reflect on what is really important.

The sacrifices we make or the extra effort we put in to become better people this Lent are all part of that spiritual journey. St Ambrose wrote;

'We have everything in Christ... He is everything for us.

If you wish to heal a wound, He is the doctor.

If you burn with fever, He is the rising spring of refreshing water.

If you have need of support, He is your strength.

If you long for heaven, He is the way.

If you seek nourishment, He is the bread.

Mass Intentions at All Saints

The majority of mass intentions at All Saints are requested for weekend masses. Currently we are not receiving as many intentions for midweek and so following on from our note in November we are still unable to guarantee a Mass intention requested for a Saturday or Sunday, they may be celebrated on Wednesday or Friday. Could we also ask that Mass Intention envelopes are put in the box on the table in the porch and not in the offertory collection as this may cause a delay in them being received in the office.

Offertory Collection Envelopes

It's getting to that time of year again when we have to order the Offertory Envelopes for the new tax year. If you have envelopes each year and want to continue to use them, you don't have to do anything; we will order new ones for you.



However....please contact the Parish Office on 01942 273851 before 1st March if....

- ◆ You would like to stop using the envelopes and would like your offertory to be made by Standing Order.
- ◆ You don't have envelopes and would like to start using them or would like your offertory to be made by Standing Order.
- ◆ You have envelopes and you no longer want to use them.
- ◆ You are gift aiding and no longer paying tax or you're a tax payer and would like to start to gift aid.

Gift Aid

If you pay tax and you Gift Aid your offerings this means that the government will pay the parish an additional 25% on top of your donation.

Card Reader

As you know we now take card payments at both our churches for anyone wishing to buy books, cards, statues or make a donation, including offertory donation.

Anyone who currently makes a weekly offertory donation by cash (not envelope) now has the option to do this electronically. However, please note we are unable to claim Gift Aid on these donations.
